Presented 2016 Orchard Summary to date

Seed orchards: got 10,600 new plants in

Numerous BC3 selections are now dying back from inoculations Some may have dropoffs from inoculations

Nanking: 13 lines, 2 more this spring so possibly 15 by next spring

New breeding orchard at Tantasqua Middle School

Inoculations – 3 orchards were done Final selections Stockbridge

Ratings at Littleton and Stockbridge

Data collection: production output from different trees in breeding orchards

We may want to refrain from collecting huge numbers of seed from certain trees

Jamie has more seed, may pot up more – will coordinate with Brian

SCA Americorps Review

Future Possible Improvements:

More training at beginning, including supervisor Moving between sites was difficult; commute time was counted

Special Americorps training site? At John Emery's house, the visit was great More training: Americorps build bridges! Motivation was missing We must do a presentation beforehand, very important Kids need to understand the importance of this work

MassWildlife: might consider paying for an SCA period if SCA could also help with invasives – will be pursued

Correction facility inmates? Often are very limited in what they can do

Island in Buzzards Bay Needs a GPA still to use our seedlings but might be solvable Bristol Aggie always has extra seedlings, might go there once legal issues solved

GPA is being revised (Lisa)

Motion: Authorized Jamie to attempt to recruit an attorney onto our Board Passed unanimously

Tantasqua High School: Jessie Green – kids were wonderful at the presentation Lois and Denis gave; also pollinated trees in tornado damage area of Monson

Town wants to highlight chestnuts

Lisa Thompson – presentation

TACF President and CEO 20 yrs with TNC TACF has 15 staff now Asheville now needs a TACF science coordinator

(We love Kendra!)

Kendra has chickens now...

Dr. Jared Westbrook's work: breeding plan is now available; is being vetted by many people, need best practices New technologies becoming available; we are hoping to be able to speed up work

Small stem assays: inoculation of seedlings as young trees, using mild blight; we then don't have to grow whole tree if non-resistant

Speeding up selection is one of Jared's main charges: hoping that they can get down to 500 trees (Meadowview)

Genomic testing price going way down Sequencing of pure Americans and Chinese Hudson-Alison Genomics – partnership likely; non-profit; \$150K per tree to map whole thing

Strategic Planning Committee: working on a shared vision America now enjoys a healthy diverse hardwood forest Our work could be a model for other hardwoods with pathogens

SUNY's work – we have different camps of beliefs 3-Bur Committee: Backcross, biocontrol, biotech Need to increase communications and trust

GMO SUNY chestnuts very likely coming; how to work with the various tree types still an issue

Perception and reality on the GMOs are often very different

We commented on how important Kendra Collins is to our work, we very greatly enjoy working with her and would like to support her as much as possible. Also the other staff.
