Brian has heard from most people re. Orchard harvests.

It is good to keep any numbers of seeds – even if smaller than a full "plot"

Orchard name – 4-character ID

BC3 orchard "selections" will have tags

Bags of seeds: clear naming of

Orchard name, 3or4-digit tree number, line ID, and harvest year

Roguing to do still:

Stockbridge, Princeton, Foster, Glocester, SKLT, NEFF-Littleton, others?

Signs for our B3 Orchard Selections so that people at these locations understand why the selections look scruffy (blight inoculations)

Sterling: lines are duplicated elsewhere; We can ask Kendra to talk to Mr. Delessandro Grafton being harvested. Rogued trees there resprouted and were flowering. Jamie would like to contact the Stockbridge contact person.

John Meiklejohn will work at re-establishing a relationship with the the Stockbridge people; Lois and Jamie can help. Need to know how to dispose of rogued trees there; Jamie's team can help. Denis can help too.

River Bend: finding out what trees are, what inventory is. Lois can work on that, hopefully with Kathy.

Yvonne also.

Please keep in mind that Tower Hill seed orchard plots are now irreplaceable; we might consider being conservative at removing.

**Americorps** – getting an agreement in place for next spring They get applications early;

Weston – last week of April
Westboro – 15-18 lines
Can they cross state lines
Weston had a crew in 2005; Denis can fill out grant

Busby/Orange – Norcross Grant for fencing; could they transfer their own grant to their own orchard?

CT might be interested in collaborating on a seed orchard?

## =>> We need legal advice for MA/CT (Norcross) - this is top priority

9 replications means lose only 5% of genetic info of a line
More than 20 lines means fewer than 9 blocks?? - Mike's statistics;
Mike will write this up for us! we have more than 20 Clapper lines (more like 30)
Weston could fit more than 20 lines; could do 30 Clapper, 20 Clapper/20 Nanking
Jared thought multiple sources of resistance could be great at one seed orchard but this is still under discussion

How many seeds/lines/etc. Will we have for Americorps people to plant

Answer: All current seed orchards will need 2016 planting help

Mike: discussed with Jared at National – can grow seedlings in Stuewe pots

Smith 7 more Weston 15 more Westboro 12-18 Granville 18 SKLT

Superblock: place for it?

How big? 5 blocks worth of space is a possibility
5 is a good size per Mike – don't need to end up with as many additional trees for Clapper 4 acre

Americorps is possible group for ongoing orchard support, per the New England Regional

We need to talk to Norcross about Superblock idea

Norcross: Americorps for ongoing one or several weeks/year

- with 20 miles of Hawley can do on a day basis
- scheduling is done by December 1st

Meeting presentation last month. They do great work

Leslie might be willing to recommend people near Norcross who can be paid person Lois will talk to Bullet and Norcross for 2016

Orleans has some trees very near Pleasant Bay, incl. The Westerly RI "Orleans" was about 600 feet from Bay, no salt damage; we hope that we might be breeding some salt tolerance into our lines by including its genes
