Event parking for 19 April 2019

EKU Facilities Services will provide continuously circulating shuttles running from a nearby parking lot (see map below) to the orchard itself. We recommend you take advantage of this to minimize traffic at the orchard site. Highly recommended if you drive a car with low clearance.



Directions to the EKU Chestnut Orchard: Please close gates behind you – keep the cows in/out!

From I-75 Take exit 87 to KY-876 E/Eastern Bypass in Richmond (heading east) about 1 mile Turn right onto Kit Cason Drive (heading south) about 1/4 mile Turn left on McKinney Skills Dr and go past the first driveway (that leads to a parking lot) and take the next right (you will see the police training center in front of you and a gravel road to the right with signs for Taylor Fork – take the gravel road. The road you take may have piles of construction materials, old stumps – don't worry, you are not going the wrong way - continue down this road, And then...

- 1. Public parking with shuttle service will be on your left. Look for the signs. It will be obvious. **GPS coordinates to public parking area: 37.728631**, **-84.299227**
- 2. Or go all the way to the orchard...continue down the gravel road. Where you will pass a field with burned out cars and then reach another gate (keep this one <u>closed</u>). Past the gate you will cross a bridge and then continue on the gravel road up a hill. That road then turns to the right and runs along a ridge. Shortly after the turn there is a turn-off on the right with the path leading to a gate near the corner of a fence. The path has no gravel. The orchard and parking are through that gate (definitely leave that one <u>closed</u>). There may or may not be signs at that turn-off directing you to the seed orchard/parking area.
