

Highlighting our Monocacy Orchard Story by Tony Sutton Our orchard at Monocacy holds some of our best looking and most mature hybrid trees. Most are B1s (three-quarters American) or B2s (seven-eighths American). The orchard has been a prime location for researching and propagating backcrossed hybrids, although the trees are now large enough that we need a bucket lift to pollinate by hand. All told, MDTACF planted 554 trees at Monocacy between 2006 and 2009. The finest 63 remain. Monocacy's conditions are so good for chestnuts that its trees outperform their own genes.

Offspring from Monocacy trees regularly perform worse than their parents in resisting the blight. Therefore, we have to correct for the advantage given to its trees when we decide
