For nearly 40 years, The American Chestnut Foundation (TACF) has led the effort to restore the American chestnut, bringing this important issue to the forefront of current conservation initiatives. TACF's 2022 American Chestnut Symposium will bring together scientists, conservationists, private landowners, and industry professionals to share information and perspectives about the American chestnut and continue to inspire reintroduction of this species to eastern forests. The meeting will provide an opportunity to enhance awareness of the importance of American chestnut restoration, explore partnerships, exchange information, and discuss this crucial mission with a wide audience.

POSTER SESSION

TACF's poster session aims to recognize the breadth of topics under investigation in the name of species restoration. It is a great way to expose attendees to the most current research, and the variety of American chestnut projects being pursued. Research posters addressing topics relative to American chestnut restoration are desired. This and other topics of interest are:

- Silviculture and forest management
- Chestnut blight, *Phytophthora cinnamomi* (ink disease), and other pests and pathogens
- Forest genetics
- Restoration and reintroduction
- Mine-land reclamation
- Forest and wildlife ecology
- History
- Timber value/use
- Breeding and biotechnology
- Other topics related to American chestnut

To have a poster considered for inclusion, submit an abstract by **August 19, 2022** to Kendra Collins: kendra.collins@acf.org. Please follow the abstract format guidelines below. Participation in the poster session by at least one author is expected of all accepted posters. The poster session will take place on Saturday, October 1, 2022. The poster abstract will be included in TACF's 2022 American Chestnut Symposium proceedings, with an option to publish a PDF of the poster on TACF's website following the meeting.

Poster Competition

We will hold a poster competition for student poster presenters and offer a cash prize for the best poster, as well as the first and second runners-up. Prizes will be \$250 for first, and \$100 each for second and third.

Students must present their poster in person during a judging session to be eligible to win. If you are a current student (undergraduate, graduate, high school, etc.) and would like to participate in the poster competition, please note this when you submit your abstract, per the instructions above. Saturday registration fees will be waived for students presenting a flash talk.

ABSTRACT FORMAT GUIDELINES

Please format your abstract as follows:

Abstract Title in Calibri, 16pt font, bold

Author last name, first initial, middle initial¹; co-author last name, first initial, middle initial²; etc. Year. (Times New Roman, 12pt font, bold)

¹Institution, address, city, state (Times New Roman, 12pt font)

²Institution, address, city, state (Times New Roman, 12pt font)

Abstract text should be limited to 200-300 words (Times New Roman, 12pt font). The abstract should contain a concise but comprehensive statement of the problem/study objective(s) and results. All abstracts should be written carefully and accurately. Abstracts that do not follow these explicit guidelines will not be accepted.
